During the ADVENT SEASON, Pastor Dave's sermon series is entitled "UNWRAPPING THE GLORY of CHRISTMAS." Last week we paused to remember GOOD FRIDAY just a few days after Black Friday. Today, the lessons from the Gospel took us to Mary's call to become the mother of our Savior.

Although the Scripture reading stopped at verse 38 of Luke 1, a few verses later is one of the most famous parts of Scripture, 'Mary's Song.' Luke obviously spoke with Mary as he wrote the Gospel to discover her reaction to being called by God. Luke carefully wrote what she told him: "With all my heart I will glorify the Lord! In the depths of who I am, I rejoice in God my savior! He has looked with favor on the low status of His servant." And, it continues.

Has there been a person/leader in your life who you wished you could have twice their spirit? What was it that made him/her special to you? Do you think there is anyone who wished they could have twice the spirit of your faith?
