Welcoming the Glory of the Lord

The Lord's glory shone around them, and they were terrified... Luke 2: 9b

Have you ever paid close attention to Luke's historic reporting of the Christmas story? I know that every Advent/Christmas season I make sure that once again I hear Linus share the reading from the Gospel of Luke on

'A Charlie Brown Christmas.' I try to watch it on TV to help the ratings, but I own at least two DVD copies as well. Here's Linus taking center stage reading from the King James version of the Gospels:

And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them.

But it's the next words that have caught my attention as I start to consider Christmas 2022, and perhaps it's the particular image of Christmas gifts that I found online that led me to the second part of verse 9. "*The Lord's glory shone around them, and they were terrified.*" It made me consider my Christmas mornings ... my God connection.

Just imagine WHAT IF one box under your Christmas tree held the glory of the Lord, and when you opened it you were surrounded by the presence of God and Christ amidst your many gifts that the jolly old elf brought down the chimney. And what if God asked, "What are you doing this Christmas ... celebrating my Son's birth, I see." Would you be terrified? I know I would be.



We have allowed our politicians to focus on whether clerks in stores say Merry Christmas even if they hold other traditions of faith that might lead them to want to say Happy Hanukkah instead. We have become angry during the Christmas season, vocally expressing our displeasure both at those clerks and also over other shoppers who bought the last item on our list; perhaps we lay on the horn at the shopping plaza when an older driver becomes confused because after all ... it is Christmas, and you need to get your shopping done.

All too many individuals have reduced their God and Christ connection to the one-hour (please no longer than one hour pastor because we must get ready for Christmas) Christmas Eve worship services that allow them to sing Silent Night Holy Night before becoming silent about Jesus throughout the rest of the year even on the date reserved to celebrate the love gift of God for all humanity.

So imagine this Christmas season that the glory of the Lord shone upon you and the angel of the Lord appeared. What can you think of doing for our God? Our Savior? Jesus, whose birth we celebrate this season? Will this be the Christmas season in which your crèche/ manger scene has prominence amongst your decorations? Is this the Advent season when you will invite family and friends to come to worship at St. Paul's—not just on Christmas Eve but on the Sundays leading up to Christmas? Will Christmas 2022 be the Christmas when

you make sure your children, grandchildren, nephews, and nieces know that December 25th is a special day, and it's not about the glowing red nose on a storybook reindeer.

Can you share your celebration of the reality of Jesus Christ... the joy you have not just for yourself but for the world? Can you be like the shepherds who were momentarily filled with fear but upon gazing at Jesus they: "*returned glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them.*"

Jesus ... a Christmas gift worth sharing in 2022 and beyond! And we each have received that special gift ... PRAISE GOD! (Right? Praise God?)

St. Paul's Food Pantry is about to celebrate our 12th year of service to the community! When I started this journey more than a decade ago, I was focused on what I could do for the church and the community. I had no idea just how much this mission would bring to me personally. I tend to be a bit shy around those outside of my family and friends, and I don't often step outside of that comfort zone. I'm known for my love of organization and my ability to whip things into shape (not literally whip, but you know what I mean). Family and friends often tease me about this. When Pastor Val Garron approached me more than a decade ago, my fingers tingled. I couldn't help myself, so I took a chance and I am so happy that I did.

Today, St. Paul's Food Pantry distributes food twice a month. We have a wonderful group of volunteers, and we'd be lost without them. During the height of the pandemic, we had to pivot to food deliveries and distribution outdoors. Our volunteers are quick to do whatever is needed, including braving the elements and sharing smiles and kind words with the folks we serve.
