I Remember ...

I remember ... Greg Lewis and Leslie Heckel. In fact, I can almost see their faces and hear their voices as we rushed out for recreation time at Vacation Bible School back in the day. I think all those 4th and 5th grade girls had a crush on Greg because the boys all seemed to think Leslie was beautiful. They were high school age volunteers who gave up their time to make Vacation Bible School so incredibly special. If I remember right, Greg and Leslie ended up getting married to each other

Our Vacation Bible School day began when the big yellow school bus pulled up in front of our home. Smiling and laughing kids were already onboard. We joined in their laughter and sometimes the entire bus would break out singing one of the popular songs from the radio as our church VOLUNTEER drove us towards a morning of good times and faith foundation.

No, we don't have a big yellow school bus to bring kids to our Vacation Bible School from July 23 to July 27, but I know that many of the kids attending our incredibly special week will be carpooling because of some extraordinary people of faith, like you, who value kids experiencing God, Jesus Christ and the basics of faith! Those kids will be gaining lifelong memories just like the memories that Mark and I have



from our annual Vacation Bible School weeks at the church the Delaneys attended.

A foundation in faith ... kids coming with excitement to church, discovering truths about God and Jesus Christ... is an interesting concept but it takes VOLUNTEERS ... it takes PARENTS, GRANDPARENTS, AUNTS & UNCLES, and others who make sure kids they know from pre-K to sixth grade get to VBS each night with excitement and smiles!

My question as July begins is, "How much do you value the next generation's faith development?" Do you have the courage to ask your children if their children can come to VBS? Do you even talk to your neighbors? If you do, can you ask if their kids would like to come to our 'western themed' VBS? What about those other kids in your lives?

Now, if you are reading this after July 27th you can always bring those kids to church on Sundays. In September our CHILDREN'S MOMENT and SUNDAY SCHOOL return! Sadly, the numbers of children ... the next generation of faith leaders ... is diminishing in almost every church in America. Many churches have no children in worship EVER! No kids on Christmas Eve ... no kids on Easter ... and no kids for a now nonexistent VBS. But we have kids every week! So I am challenging all of you and our team ... if we get 70 or more kids this summer I will get covered in a multicolored array of colors from paint balls on the closing night!

We need TEACHERS ... WE NEED VOLUNTEERS ... WE NEED KIDS ... and therefore we NEED YOU to make this year's VBS an incredible success story!!!
