In Need of Green Candle Prayers

"Light one candle for the strength that we need."

On our "Healing Sunday" I shared the news that I wish I didn't need to share. I told those gathered together that morning that since March I have known that I have cancer. During these months when people asked me how I was, truthfully I wasn't "fine" or ok. Frankly, I have had my moments of being very self-focused since that doctor's appointment notice and I have slipped more than a few times in my relationship with others.

We started lighting the green candle for individuals with cancer many months ago because our congregation, like many other collectives of humans, had far too many people battling that evil word cancer. We have kept those individuals in our prayers. We have prayed for their family members and their health care providers. We have prayed for a cure. During all those months I was the last person who I ever envisioned being in need of the "green candle prayers."

As I noted in church in June, my prostate cancer is treatable and controllable. I am already taking medication to reduce my prostate while receiving the hormone therapy that will help me win this battle. I am so happy to have a Fox Chase team working with me. I have been assured that the impact of the treatment will be minimal and that I will be able to pretty much maintain a full work schedule. But ... there may be times when I am unexpectedly



tired. There may be times when I am irritable. The worst impact on me is that there may be times when I experience 'hot flashes' and this boy from Buffalo hates the heat. I am asking that my medical team act aggressively on my behalf, and that's what they are doing.

We have church members and friends of the church who are dealing with cancers that are significantly worse than mine, so I do not want to be treated any differently that you were treating me before June 30th when I shared my condition. When I light the green candle, I will be thinking of them and their families.

I also want to urge every man to make sure you get tested for cancer! Every woman too but men are stubborn when it comes to taking care of ourselves! I should know because both my heart issue and cancer might have had easier treatment regimens if they had been caught earlier.

I also am doing my best to find the "still waters to restore my soul" and to focus on being happy rather than just allowing life to swallow me up. As one friend noted when they found out, "Your faith has helped you," and they are right. I have been holding tightly onto God these past few months.

In one of their songs, R.E.M. sings "When your day is long and the night is yours alone; when you're sure you've had enough of this life, well hang on! Don't let yourself go, 'cause everyone cries, everybody hurts sometimes." I have played the song numerous times but then I go back to Philippians and remember, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, REJOICE!"

This is a perfect game ... midsummer and a Phillies team that is definitely outstanding! But the main thing is having fun!


